Notes

All University requirements, Berkeley campus requirement, college prerequisites and requirements (with the exception of one breadth, as described below), and major requirements must be taken for a letter grade and met with a minimum grade of C-. Transfer students will take the inside-CED urban studies upper-division electives and upper-division major work after matriculation.

* Students transferring from other colleges at UC Berkeley and simultaneous degrees students may petition to substitute other courses for ENV DES 11A and 11B. Junior-level transfers into UC Berkeley and starting freshmen in the college may petition to substitute another course for ENV DES 11B.

** Must be from a specified departmental list with at least one course having urban history content.

*** Must be from a specified departmental list with at least one course having international content.

Guidelines for Seven-Course Breadth Requirements

- A minimum of 2 units is required for each breadth course.
- You may not use courses numbered 97, 98, 99, or above 190 for breadth courses.
- You may not use courses from your major department or the College of Environmental Design (including cross-listed courses).
- You may not use more than two courses from any one department.
- Participation in the UC Education Abroad Program (or a recognized equivalent program) satisfies the International Studies requirement.
- With the exception of the Social and Behavioral Sciences requirement, you may take one breadth course on a passed/not passed basis; all other breadth requirements must be met with a minimum grade of C-.
